I worked for 38 years at the Roswell Park Memorial Cancer Institute, and retired in 1992. I moved to the Buffalo General Hospital-Kaleida Health System, the main teaching hospital of our medical school, the State University of New York at Buffalo. I continue as Professor of Internal Medicine and as Senior Member of the Graduate School. The latter appointment allows me to continue to advise graduate student working toward a Ph.D. degree. I have started a program where Fellows in Hematology-Oncology at the same time enroll in the graduate school and work for their Ph.D. degree while also working for their specialty board certification through the fellowship. Before retirement I was also Chairman of the Department of Experimental Pathology in the Graduate School. During my service, a total of over 100 students graduated with a Master's Degree or Ph.D. Degree, some together with an M.D. degree and some together with fellowship training in Hematology-Oncology. I was directly responsible for advising thesis work for 30 of these students. During visiting lectureships at medical schools in this country and abroad, I often find some of our ex-graduates who are by now Professors in the Hematology-Oncology field.

I continue to run a research laboratory with several graduate students doing thesis research. We also have a program in the medical school where medical students can spend selected blocks of time or additional weeks and vacation time working on their thesis and graduate in an honors M.D. program. Several of these students are also working in my laboratory.

Additionally, I continue as the Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Medicine, and of Hematology Reviews.
